Day 1: Welcome to Chile, August 21st

Arrival and Welcome Cocktail

Arrival in Santiago de Chile, a modern and sophisticated city embraced by the majestic Andes, where your great experience in Chile will begin. We will check in at the hotel to close the day with a welcome cocktail at Ofelia Restaurant (located inside the hotel).

- Meals: Welcome cocktail.
- Accommodation: Hotel Pullman Vitacura.

Day 2: Saturday, August 22nd

The Awakening of the Strait & Footprints of History

Your adventure begins by flying over the majesty of the Andes until landing in Punta Arenas, the mythical gateway to Chilean Patagonia and the legendary Strait of Magellan.

- City Tour (15:30 hrs): We will walk through the streets of a city sculpted by navigators and pioneers. We will discover the opulence of the 19th century by visiting the majestic Sara Braun Palace and immerse ourselves in the archaeological mysteries, fauna, and soul of the indigenous peoples at the Maggiorino Borgatello Museum.
- Flavors with Identity (19:30 hrs): We will celebrate your arrival with a welcome dinner at AIMA restaurant. More than a meal, it will be a sensory encounter with fire, southern cuisine, and the freshest ingredients of the region.

At nightfall, you will take refuge in the heart of the city. Part of the group will stay in the modernist elegance of the iconic Hotel Cabo de Hornos, facing the Plaza de Armas, while others will soak up the charm of the historic 1929 mansion at the boutique hotel La Yegua Loca.



Day 3: Sunday, August 23rd

The Ice Odyssey: Glacier Avenue

Today the alarm rings early (04:00 hrs), because the reward lies in the most remote and breathtaking corners of Tierra del Fuego.

- Full Day "Glacier Avenue" (04:30 hrs): We will board a modern catamaran to venture into the Agostini Fjord, a pristine sanctuary where mountains plunge into the sea. We will brave the wind to admire the Águila Glacier, surrounded by a protected and peaceful environment, and the imposing Cóndor Glacier, with its active and majestic blue ice walls crashing into the ocean. We will sail surrounded by hanging glaciers and marine wildlife in their natural habitat.

After a dazzling day, we will return to Punta Arenas to share stories over an exclusive dinner at the Hotel Cabo de Hornos restaurant, a five-star venue that promises to delight your palate.

Day 4: Monday, August 24th

The Dawn of the Dolphins & Ranch Tradition

Kayak and Dolphin Navigation (09:30 hrs): We will travel to Bahía Agua Fresca to experience a magical morning. We will connect with the Patagonian silence while kayaking or sailing under the subtle light of dawn, accompanied by the wonderful dance of the Peale's dolphins that inhabit these waters.

The Fire Ritual (13:00 hrs): Adventure awakens the appetite. We will take shelter in rural hospitality to enjoy an authentic Magellanic lamb roast on a spit, slow-cooked over the coals, while sharing the customs and tales of country life. After lunch, we return to Punta Arenas.

Dinner (19:30 hrs): We will crown the day by dining at La Yegua Loca restaurant. Its cuisine pays homage to the recipes of the region's immigrant families—a parade of contemporary delights such as lamb shank, Croatian gnocchi, or king crab risotto, sweetened with the mystical calafate berry.



Day 5: Tuesday, August 25th

The Edge of America and the Exploring Spirit

Visit to the Strait Park and Fort Bulnes National Historic Monument (10:00 hrs): We will travel 52 km south to the Strait of Magellan Park to hike low and medium-difficulty trails. We will walk through the wooded lenga trails on the Punta Santa Ana peninsula and enter Fort Bulnes, the legendary first settlement that consolidated Chilean sovereignty in these southern lands. The panoramic views of the strait here are simply stunning. Return to Punta Arenas.

Destination Presentation at Explorers House (15:30 hrs): Back in the city, we will gather in the auditorium of Explorers House (Antarctica21). This old wool warehouse from the last century has been masterfully rehabilitated, intertwining the productive past with visions of tomorrow's exploration.

Dinner at Estancia Río de los Ciervos (19:30 hrs): Your last night in Magallanes deserves a dream setting. We will travel to Estancia Río de los Ciervos to enjoy a dinner steeped in livestock tradition, rural history, and authentic flavors that will ensure you carry Patagonia in your heart.

Day 6: Wednesday, August 26th

Return

At the agreed time, return to Santiago.

- Meals: Breakfast and lunch.
- Accommodation: Hotel Pullman Vitacura.



Day 7: Business Roundtable, August 27th

Connect with the Chilean tourism industry

We will have breakfast at Ofelia Restaurant, then begin the first session of the business roundtable in the Madrid Room of the Pullman hotel. We will have an executive lunch, followed by the second session of the business roundtable, finishing with a networking cocktail.

- Meals: Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.
- Accommodation: Hotel Pullman Vitacura.

Day 8: Wine Tourism Experience, August 28th

Enjoy the best of the Maipo Valley

We will have breakfast at Ofelia Restaurant and check out of the hotel. Then, we will head to the Cousiño Macul Winery, located in the city of Santiago. Here we will experience a vertical wine tasting, followed by a cellar tour and a premium wine pairing lunch. Cousiño Macul Winery is a jewel of Chilean wine tourism. Founded in 1856, it is the only 19th-century winery in Chile that remains in the hands of its founders, now in its sixth generation. This continuity translates into a passion for quality and a deep respect for the identity of its terroir.

Finally, we will transfer to the Santiago airport to return home and bring our Chilean adventure to a close.

- Meals: Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.
- Accommodation: Hotel Pullman Vitacura.
